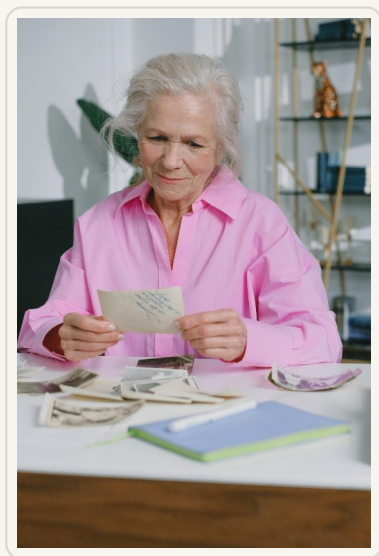

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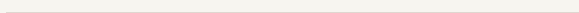
CHAPTER ONE

What kind of world were you born into?

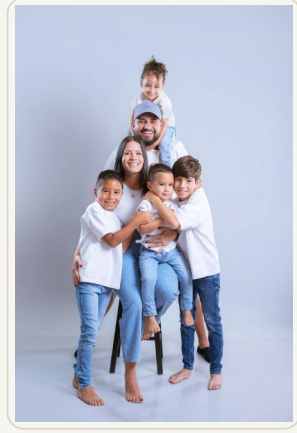

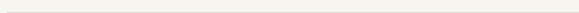
CHAPTER TWO

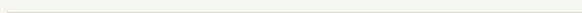
CHAPTER THREE
